Between 11 MAY and 13 SEP we ran eleven (11) Severe Weather Nets ranging from 45 minutes to 6 hours duration during our CANWARN Program (in 2014 there were 4 Severe Weather Nets). There were 12 Test/Familiarization/Service sessions. We utilized VE4MAN owned by the Manitoba Repeater Society for twenty-six (26) hours during Severe Weather Nets (VE4MAN is located on a site owned by CBC, MRS is supposed to keep track of how much time MAN is used for emergency communications).

19 out of 25 CANWARN Net Controllers were able to volunteer for on-call shifts this year (twelve hours/day for seventeen weeks):

# Basic Short Course 10 Graduates By David VE4DAR

Following the exam, long-time ham Dave Place VE4PN, gave a presentation on getting started in our hobby. Students benefited from his presentation, augmented by samples of various equipment and enhanced by stories of his service with ARES and overseas with the Canadian Red Cross.



# Early Wireless and Radio in Manitoba, 1909-1924

(Taken from a Manitoba Historical Society document by George F. Reynolds (VE4AG) published in the 1978-1979 season) Submitted by Ed VE4YU

Less than eight years after Marconi had first spanned the Atlantic by wireless on December 12, 1901, amateur operators, or "hams" as they are generally known, were active in Manitoba.

In the fall of 1909, Alex V. Polson and some of his classmates at Central Collegiate Institute on Kate Street began experimenting with wireless. Young Polson had visited a United Wireless Telegraph Company station while traveling in the eastern United States that summer. When he returned to Winnipeg he told his friends all about the marvels of wireless and they decided to build an outfit of their own.

Their transmitter had a one-inch spark coil, glass plate condenser, tuning helix and spark gap. Messages were sent from Polson's home at 94 Cathedral Avenue to Melville Sayer who was living on Graham Avenue in the Alexandria Block.

The receiver consisted of a Hughes-type microphonic detector, which had a steel needle resting on carbon prisms, a tuning coil and headphones.

This is the first recorded use of wireless in Manitoba. Because of the success that attended these trials, there were soon many others who took up this new and fascinating hobby.

In February, 1911, the Canadian Central Wireless Club was organized in Winnipeg. Available records suggest that this was the first amateur wireless club in Canada. The Wireless Association of Toronto came into existence later that year.

In March, 1919, the Winnipeg Radio Club was formed. The president was J. Ralph Foster; vice-president was Douglas C. Chapman while the energetic secretary was Graham Spry.

Spry, Manitoba Rhodes scholar in 1922, later became co-founder and president of the Canadian Radio League. The league was the driving force behind the establishment of nation-wide, publicly owned broadcasting in Canada which culminated in the incorporation of the CBC.

The club met in the old red brick University of Manitoba Arts building on Kennedy Street just north of the Law Courts. There were some 20 members, mostly war vets with signaling experience plus a few students.
