

The 2016 operation ran from approximately 0530-1330h.

Ultimately, eighty-one (81) Amateur volunteers were assigned to each Hospitality Station, Relay Exchange Zone, five Course Vehicles (Lead Full, Lead Half, Course Closing, 2 Sweep Vans), Start Line, Medical Vehicles (1 Medical Transport, 2 Therapy, 2 Medical Supply and "Courier Motorcycle "Bike 10), Hospitality Net Control, Medical Net Control and Care Centre.

Three (3) non-Amateur volunteers supported our operation. Of the 81 volunteers involved, nine (9) were new or "newer" Amateurs that were partnered with Amateurs with previous Manitoba Marathon experience.


