



### Spotlight on Irv Cosgrove VE4UG By David VE4DAR

Note to Readers:

This is the first of a series of interviews with local amateur radio operators, who have been licensed for at least 20 years. My idea is to give our newer hams a sense of how our hobby developed and who was involved. These are not biographies; they are brief stories presented in random order. Truth be told, I'm grabbing interviews whenever I can.



I corralled Irv Cosgrove for an interview at the Seniors Club's picnic in September. Irv told me he got interested in ham radio in grade school. One day, while delivering groceries after school, he saw a ham station at one of the homes. The owner showed Irv around his shack and helped him make some contacts. This sparked Irv's interest, and so began a 56-year journey in electronics.

Irv got licensed in 1960, while serving as a electronics technician in the Canadian Air Force. A sergeant in Signals taught him CW. Irv built a Heathkit DX40 transmitter and used a military receiver (AR88?). His antennas have been homebrew dipoles. At Southport, Portage La Prairie, the CO got Irv to set up a ham station for Air Cadets there.

What have you got out of ham radio over the years? "A sense of satisfaction...I feel good about what I accomplished." "I like the basic ham radio. I've tried the other modes such as digital and IRLP, but I like the

basic point to point contact best."
Not having contested, Irv didn't talk about awards.


Among other things, Irv's public service has been during the Marathons and floods. Until recently he was a member of ARES.

Any advice for new hams? "Join a club and get involved. Explore various modes to see what you like."

What's the future for amateur radio? "It's going to get away from basic ham radio. I think it's going to go very hi tech." Many thanks for this, Irv.
