Spotlight On: Barry Malowanchuk VE4MA By David VE4DAR

David's note: Last June, I interviewed several hams licensed at least 20 years at WARC's Field Day in St. Vital Park. Barry was showing his newly licensed son, Darryl VE4MTN, "the ropes" of Field Day.



What got you interested in amateur radio? "I grew up with it being around my father, Andy VE4MA, who was a broadcast engineer."

Did you take a class? "No class, I learned from my father in his ham shack. I got my ticket in 1974."

Build or buy equipment? "I built some and modified surplus equipment."

Contacts or moments that stick out in memory: "Hearing the moon bounce signal tape in 1965 from the Aercibo Observatory Dish (1000' diameter dish in Puerto Rico). Also doing the first moon bounce here."

What have you got out of ham radio? "Lots of technical knowledge and skills. Lots of good friends world wide."

Particular interest in amateur radio: "Bouncing signals off the moon from the beginning and moving higher in frequency as technology improved. Blazing a trail."

Public Service: "Giving papers about ham radio and doing presentations at ham conferences. Doing technidal research."

Advice for new hams: "Try digital modes; you can get on the air with low power and work the world."

Future of amateur radio: "It will become less a handson hobby. As the baby boomers fade away, the number of experimenters and technical people will reduce. However, there will be lots of operators on the air."

Manitoba Disaster Management
Conference 2020

AEC Winnipeg ARES

The Manitoba Disaster Management Conference is held about every 18 months. The conference gives both Manitoba ARES & Winnipeg ARES complimentary registration. This year Wayne Warren, VE4WR (DEC Northern Region & Special Projects) represented Manitoba ARES, and myself for Winnipeg. Jeff Dovyak, VE4MBQ (DEC Capital Region, and other hats), was there for his employer, but helped with some ARES questions.

I'm not going to go into details of presentations, but will mention what I attended during the 3 days of the conference.

The first Key Note speaker was Frank DeAngelis. Mr. De, as his students knew him, was the principal of Columbine High School 20 April 1999. Hearing how to events unfolded from his view & not the media was very eye opening for me. He also went into some more recent related events, not covered by the media. He also pointed out that this wasn't the first school shooting, but the first with social media therefore it gained so much world attention.

During the lunch break, attended a short presentation by BlackBerry. They covered secure communications in emergencies. Interesting, but not aimed for ARES.

Next came Manitoba Emergency Alerting Program. We all should know that Alert Ready is somewhat new in Canada. This covered a little of the history of the program, what it is,

what it isn't & who can send out an Alert in Manitoba. The Q&A portion reinforced the problems in some of the isolated communities.

The day ended with When Your Community is Overwhelmed: the Gillam Experience. Dwayne Forman, Mayor of Gillam & Asst Commissioner Jane MacLatchy CO of RCMP D Division, covered the effect on the town when the RCMP arrived this past summer looking for 2 suspected murders. The RCMP acknowledged the assistance from local hunters & fishermen. Some of the short term effects on the town. Next the question is what will the long term effect be?

Day 2 began with The Evolving Role of the ECCC Meteorologist. As a member of CanWarn I've known that ECCC has a large role to play, I never knew just how LARGE that role is. Natalie Hasell (VE4NAT) & Eric Dykes made the 3 1/2 hour presentation fly. I'm going to mention that in March Natalie will once again be the Meteorologist during our CanWarn training.

Post lunch started with Cultural Awareness in Emergencies. A number of years ago I attended the Winnipeg Emergency Management Course & I've heard some of this before. What I found most interesting in this presentation came again in the Q&A section. There were a few First Nation communities represented & they mentioned some unique problems they have (with disaster management) due to their culture and traditions.

I ended the day attending Severe Weather: Working Together Enhancing Resilience. The presenter was very knowledgeable, but the session wasn't what I was expecting and not for me.

Miracle on the Hudson: A Passenger's Perspective, Vallie Collins, survivor. This was how the 3rd day began. I've always preferred the "I was there" as to "I heard". This young lady told the story as she saw it unfold. The only question she was asked, at the end, was about the movie "Sully". Her reply was that there was more water in the aircraft then the move showed, and more chaos exiting the plane than depicted. I haven't watched that movie, but want to now!

Risk Perceptions and Effective Emergency Management Programs. I can't think of how to explain this topic. I'll use my own words..How to get the bean counters to invest in Emergency Management & overcome the "it won't happen here" attitude.

Last came Leader Bucket – Crisis Leadership in Emergency Management Refill Your Leadership Bucket. During 19 years military service I soon realized leadership is a skill. Like all skills anyone can learn it, few master leadership. The difference between management & leadership was well explained. Hopefully I never find myself in a stressful situation where I have to take the lead, but I know what was covered here will help me.

- Members nominating such a candidate must ensure that the member is willing to stand for office before nominating him/her.
- To be eligible to stand for office, a person must be a member in good standing for at least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
