Spotlight on Hamish Donaldson VE4JDH By David Rosner VE4DAR

What got you interested in amateur radio? David Rosner brought Geoff Bawden, then RAC President, to a Macintosh Computer Club meeting. Geoff's talk made me interested in amateur radio.

I bought commercial equipment as I am not a great technical person.

Any contacts or moments that stick out in your memory? Driving my wife crazy learning the phonetic alphabet.

What have you gotten out of ham radio over the years? A group of new friends and experiences that are great.

Any part of ham radio that interested you particularly? I would like to learn more about the tech side without leaning on someone else and bother-



ing them with question after question.

What kind of public service have you done? I believe I have done every marathon since the exam. I try to help when I am able but the physical part is now off limits.

Any advice for new hams? Forget anything else during the ham course as there is a lot to learn in a short time. You can relax after the exam.

What do you see as the future for Amateur Radio? I hope it appeals to younger people and they get involved as the majority of us are getting on in years and none of us is immortal.
