Our June General Meeting featured a presentation of "Thank You" letters to 2012 Air Force Run ARES volunteers by three RCAF Representative: CPL Compton, Lt Mai and WO Hibbs who each expressed deep appreciation for the ARES communication net for the event. The 2012 event raised in excess of \$30 000 for the "Soldier On" Charity Fund. We also had some discussions about the Amateur Operation for the 2012 Manitoba Marathon that saw eighty-one (81) Amateurs covering ninety-two (92) positions in addition to seven (7) support volunteers. The Manitoba Marathon remains the largest single regularly scheduled Amateur Radio operation in Manitoba. Jim Sutton VE4SIG also contributed to equipment modernization by installing *Anderson PowerPole* connectors on two of our old mobiles that had "oddball" power connectors – Jim also facilitated the acquisition of two HD *Powerwerx* Cigarette Lighter cords to increase the flexibility of those two older mobile radios.

ARES at Wildfire Preparedness Seminar Jeff Dovyak VE4MBQ Acting SEC Manitoba ARES

South-Central ARES DEC Gord Snarr VE4GLS, South-Central ARES member Tedd Vidler VE4VID and myself represented ARES at the first-ever Wildfire Preparedness Seminar organized by Manitoba EMO in Steinbach THURS 03 MAY.

In the past few years it has become common before Spring Flood season for EMO to host flood Preparedness Seminars in areas likely to be affected (e.g. Brandon & Morris) but the problem of Wildland - Urban Interface Fires is relatively new (4 day Stuartburn fire last fall on Thanksgiving weekend and a number of wildland fires already this spring).

The topics included:

- -Seasonal Weather Forecast
- -Fire Smart Community Program
- -Fire Mutual Aid Program
- -Manitoba Conservation Fire Program
- -Evacuation/ ESS Concerns
- -EOC considerations with regard to Wildland-Urban --
- -Interface Fires and other considerations that have come up in rural communities in the recent past.

Organizations in attendance included:

- -Manitoba EMO
- -Office of the Fire Commissioner
- -Manitoba Conservation
- -Office of Disaster Management Manitoba Health
- -Emergency Social Services

(Ministry of Family Services &Labour)

- -Environment Canada

- -A number of Municipal Emergency Coordinators &Rural Fire Chiefs.

Nicki Albus, the Manitoba EMO Regional Emergency Manager that organized the seminar asked us if we could bring out some Amateur Gear for an informal show& tell session.

Gord VE4GLS got the Municipal Emergency Coordinator for City of Steinbach/RM of Hanover Dennis Vassart to bring out the Amateur Radio kit that is contained in a wooden box in the Steinbach EOC (VE4SFD).



Tedd VE4VID brought out his personal gear that was used during 2009 Flood Ops when he and Kent HaaseVE4KEH were deployed to St Adolphe. The gear in the VE4SFD box is also present in the Town of Winkler EOC and consideration is being given to construction of a similar box for Winkler to make the gear easy to transport one town over to Morden when required. Tedd, Gord and myself were at Tedd's truck during the morning coffee break and during the lunch break and answered questions from several interested Municipal Emergency Coordinators - Manitoba EMO encourages municipal emergency Coordinators to consider ARES for communications support.

Winnipeg ARES Inc covered the cost of our lunches and to me the seminar was well worth taking a vacation day from work to attend.

Basic Short Courses By David VE4DAR

WARC's new Basic Short Course 1 (BSC1) opened to applications on a first come, first served basis on July 16. Persons on the "interested list" were invited to submit the course registration form with \$25.00 for tuition. The tuition covers two new study booklets and course instruction. The class is now full with 18 students enrolled.

Classes will be held at the Winnipeg Senior Citizens Radio Club on Saturdays, September 22 & 29, and October 6 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. All instructors are experienced, licensed Amateur Radio Operators. Students getting 70% or better on Industry Canada's 100 question, multiple-choice examination will receive the Amateur Radio Operator Certificate, Basic Qualification and a call sign.

Persons interested in Basic Short Course 2 (BSC2) on Oct 20, 27 & Nov 3 can email the Chief Instructor at ve4dar@rac.ca to be placed on the next "interested list". Name, phone number, and email address are required. Course information and a registration form will be sent. Registration will be on a first come, first served basis. No other Basic Courses are planned at this time.

RAC Bulletin 2012-049E Non-Amateur Use of Frequency in BC 2012-08-22

From August 5th to 12th, the Canadian Paragliding National Championships were held in Pemberton, BC. The Radio Amateurs of Canada became extremely concerned about the organizers assertion that all participants must use a VHF radio tuned to 146.415 Mhz. This frequency is inside the two meter amateur allocation. Amateur operators are the primary user of this band and incursion by non-authorized users is of great concern.

RAC has been in contact with representatives from the Paragliding community and has also requested enforcement action to be taken by Industry Canada. The Radio Amateurs of Canada does not generally discuss enforcement while an investigation in ongoing. However, given the scope of concern over this matter it is appropriate to release details of actions to date.

Industry Canada has advised this morning that their British Columbia office has notified the group that use of Amateur Radio Frequencies by persons who are not in possession of a valid Amateur Radio Operator's Certificate is not permitted. The group has assured Industry Canada that all participants who used the channel were indeed holders of a certificate. A notice indicating the requirement to hold an operators certificate has been added to the website of the group.

Additionally, Industry Canada has advised the group of a VHF frequency inside the Aeronautical Radio Frequency Band that has been allocated for their use on a Canada Wide basis.

The Radio Amateurs of Canada has prioritized protection of Amateur Radio Frequencies from incursion. If you suspect incursion on an Amateur Band or are aware of the illegal operation of Amateur Radio products by individuals or companies that do not hold operators certificates, contact the Radio Amateurs of Canada to report your concerns.

The Radio Amateurs of Canada is the national voice of Amateur Radio Operators in Canada. Our members enjoy numerous benefits including access to The Canadian Amateur publication. We extend frequency protection work to members and non-members alike to ensure the future of our hobby and emergency service work.

If you keep up with Amateur Radio news, you will have heard about the ARRL's Logbook Of The World. Any of you readers who are Dxers, Contesters or Certificate Chasers, or maybe you just want to keep a well organized record of your Amateur Radio achievements, should sign up with LOTW.

There is no charge to join, but to get awards, there is a fee. This is a virtual log on the web maintained by ARRL and at present there are about 53,000 Radio Amateurs worldwide that upload their activity logs. I have uploaded over25,000 contacts which covers many contests and the last two years (of 58) of my logbook.

The automatic process checks for matches with the other participants and shows the confirmed contacts. I have over 11,000matches so far. The site shows a detailed record of countries and states worked on each band, as well as a listing of all your uploads and totals. In Canada, you must mail (snail mail) a copy of your license (certificate) and a copy of your driver's license or photo id to ARRL to be registered. This is destroyed once your valid license is confirmed. Thanks Rick VE4RA, for getting me involved!

The HF bands are active with DX, especially between 4-7 PM local time on 15 & 20M. 15 & 10M are still open only at certain times but will open up more as

winter approaches. If you haven't experienced HF operations, you are missing half the fun of Amateur Radio..

SHARP Receives Education Grant from the Radio Amateurs of Canada Robert Striemer(VE4SHS)

SHARP, the Shaftesbury High Altitude Robotics Project is an extra-curricular club run out of Shaftesbury High School in Winnipeg. SHARP students have built, launched, tracked and recovered two high altitude balloons (HABs).

The HABs are tracked using the APRS (automatic packet reporting system). SHARP-2 flew in October 2011. It was launched from Elkhorn, Manitoba, achieved an altitude of 126000 feet and two and a half hours after launch it returned to the Earth by parachute, landing near McGregor, Manitoba.

Amateur radio is key to SHARP flights so each year some of our students will take ham classes at lunch hour and challenge the basic certification exam. SHARP is frequently assisted by local hams including Alan Thoren (VE4YZ), Bruce Feaver (VE4BDF) and Dr. Craig Martin (VE4CDM) who is conveniently located across the street from Shaftesbury at the Canadian Mennonite University.

SHARP also gets technical assistance from hams at the University of Manitoba in the Faculty of Engineering including Dr. Withold Kinsner (VE4WK) and grad student Dario Schor (VE4SCH). SHARP graduates have gone on to study in the Faculty of Engineering at the U of M, Queens and Carlton. (please see: http://www.umsats.ca/sharp-workshop/)

SHARP-3 is now in the assembly stage. If all goes to plan, it will fly before the end of October 2012. In addition to interesting science experiments, SHARP-3 will include our first radio controlled glider experiment.

SHARP spends a great deal of time each year in promotion and fund raising and a similar amount of time analyzing and presenting the data obtained with each flight. A video of the flight is produced. It's been a crunch if not panic to assemble the payload, test equipment and prepare for flight in October.


Each June SHARP loses its older students (grade 12s graduate) and takes in younger ones (grades 9 and 10). The October flight represents an exciting introduction to amateur radio and high altitude balloons for our new students.

On May 30th, SHARP received a grant from the Radio Amateurs of Canada for \$750. The funds will be used to purchase some hardware including a couple of hand held transceivers, a programming kit, a Byonics Micro-Fox 15 transmitter for fox hunting exercises (ARDF)

and materials for building tape measure Yagi antennas. The HTs and directional antennas will be of great help in training the students in amateur radio operations and will be used by SHARP in the field to track and recover high altitude balloon payloads and gliders that may be out of range of APRS repeaters.

Amateur radio direction finding exercises will provide a useful instructional tool for our students. The fact that ARDF activities will be conducted outdoors and can be of a competitive nature should add a fun element to the usual classroom instruction.

Winnipeg's "D-Star Gateway to the World" VE4WDR is now into it's second year thanks to Icom, George at Micro-HighTech and radio station CJNU.

It's been quite the year and quite the learning curve to get the system installed, on the air on UHF, connected to the D-Star Gateway, then on the air on VHF and 1.2 G Data. It did take some trials and testing, filtering and pre-amping to get the system to a reliable state by December 2011 giving Winnipeg Hams the opportunity to participate in the various D-Star nets such as the Friday Night Can Net, the HamNation D-Star Net or rag chewing on the various Reflectors.

The VHF repeater has since been improved thanks to Garth, VE4GWB, for hunting down a 4 bay VHF antenna and to VE4DS (Pronounced VE4"D-Star") for trucking it to Winnipeg for us. We got it installed June 3, 2012, improving the coverage on VHF.
