A RAC Bulletin Revised RAC 0-30 MHz Band Plan Released

The revised RAC 0-30 MHz Band Plan has been released with the effective date of December 1, 2015. This replaces the January 1, 2015 Band Plan version. It incorporates several updates to reflect feedback received on the earlier version. The Band Plan graphics have also been changed to improve readability and make it easier to determine which segments are recommended for which modes, especially for those who are colourblind.



A group of 4 were present and learned some valuable kit building techniques.







Canadian 0 - 30MHz Band Plan

Effective Date: December 1, 2015

- **1.** This is a simplified version of the official RAC Band Plan. Not all permissible modes/activities are represented.
- **2.** LSB is used on 160, 80 and 40m. USB is used on all other bands that permit SSB, including 60m.
- **3.** Consult various online resources for detailed information on what digital modes are used.
- **4.** Maximum bandwidth permitted on 2200m is 100 Hz. Maximum power is 1 Watt EIRP.
- **5.** Refer to the IC and RAC websites for full details before operating on the new 60m channels.
- **6.** Remember not to allow your signal to spill over into adjoining band segments when operating close to the edges. During major weekend contests, activity in certain modes can spill over into other segments. Operators should avoid NCDXF beacons on 14.100, 18.110, 21.150, 24.930 and 28.200 MHz.
- 7. This graphic is a living document and will be reviewed and updated periodically to reflect changes in the band plans and operating habits.

Planning for BSC 11 By David VE4DAR

Barely retired from teaching at Shaftesbury High School, Rob Striemer VE4SHS agreed to be WARC's Chief Instructor for the Basic Short Courses. Readers remember Rob for his leadership with satellite launches by weather balloons and in establishing the Telebridge Station. Perhaps you've seen Rob and colleague Adrian Deacon VA4AMD with students during Field Day and at recent Flea Markets?

Recently Rob and I met to review the course planning checklist. We decided to aim for having Basic Short Course 11 (BSC 11) in Feb/Mar so graduates could participate in satellite launches in the early Spring. Shaftesbury High School is the desired classroom location. Updating the Yellow Folder for students has been completed. Roger Froebe VE4RLF worked on updating the Elmer List. This time we plan to assign an Elmer to each student at registration. Rob is starting to contact potential instructors to develop a Course Schedule.

After the course dates and the classroom location have been confirmed, advertising will begin and registrations will be accepted. The new 2m net on Saturday mornings should help students and neophyte hams get on-the-air. Stay tuned!

VA4WAN, Hamwan, Hinternet, HSMM

For the past two years a project has been slowly growing and moving along. It has changed names



many times along the way as the project grew. And to tell you the truth, we still don't know what to call the project. What I can tell you is that we are part of the Winnipeg Digital Radio Group, the same group that brought D-Star to Winnipeg. We have a callsign and we have a registered domain. So for now just call us VA4WAN.

VA4WAN is a group of amateur radio operators building a Winnipeg-wide wireless network using Wi-Fi devices that operate at frequencies that have been allocated by Industry Canada for amateur radio use (2.3GHz and 5.9GHz).

To date we have set up a site with 4 - 90 degree sector antennas on 2.3GHz providing 360 degree coverage (a small slice to the south east is not covered) to the city of Winnipeg. Connected to this is an intranet that can provide a host of capabilities to those who want to connect to us. We also have a very high-speed connection to the Internet through VE4LES, who owns an internet connection point les.net which has a presence on the Hurricane Electric pipe, a major provider of internet connectivity. As we are part of the AMPR.org community, for all intents and purposes, it looks like we are connected directly to the University of California San Diego. Our connection to Les.net is about ~100mbps upload and download. We take that connection and use it to provide outside access to portions of our intranet.

Already connected and running

We have a virtual server that has running on it;

- Asterisk a telephony system providing voice over I/P (VOIP) telephone service to amateur radio users. Check our public Google link below for a listing of telephone extensions.
- Web server provides web space to any amateur radio group who wants it for their use. Right now we have the va4wan.ampr.org and the ve4wsc.ampr.org websites on this server. The Manitoba Repeater Soci-

ety will be ported over shortly. If any other group wishes to move their site over, please contact William, VE4VR.

 We will be installing a collaboration server for those hams who want to learn about networking and servers or whatever. It is really up to the users to decide what they want on this server.

Right now we are providing a connection to the internet for the VE4WDR – D-Star gateway. The Manitoba Repeater Society is also planning on using us a connection for their intra/internet of repeaters. We can provide a connection for any other repeater group that wants or needs an internet connection for their repeater(s) as well.

There are plans to connect up with the University of Manitoba amateur radio club. Once this is formally and physically connected, we will have a redundant internet connection for both VA4Wan and Umars.

Our main site is located in the Osborne village area on a very tall apartment block and we have one remote site operating in the West end area of Winnipeg. We are partially installed a remote link to a site in Woodlands Manitoba. And a site is being negotiated in South St. Vital. Plus we are planning a remote site at the Winnipeg Seniors club and another in South Transcona.

We are actively looking for suitable sites in St. James/ Charleswood and East or West Kildonan. To date the following users are connected to the system, VE4VR, VE4DRK, VE4HAY, VE4CST, VE4VB, VE4EA, VE4WSC and obtaining speeds of up & down to ~4mbps.

The Winnipeg Amateur Radio Club has asked us to do a presentation on our project, and we are working on putting something together right now for presentation in the spring. In the meantime, to learn more about what we are up to and what we are planning, check out our website, VE4wan.ampr.org. But I must warn you. Our efforts are on the network and getting it fully operational and not on keeping our web site updated.
